Holston Home served popcorn, cookies and drinks to guests.

Planning for the event got underway in late October. Williams said he doesn't remember whose idea it was, but both youth and staff at Holston Home were enthusiastic about it.

"That's probably the mark of a good idea," he said. "It was kind of a team idea."

Holston Home youth have several Christmas events for the facility's immediate neighbors, but Williams said the idea behind Winter Wonderland was to do something for the entire Greene County commu-
