He went on to point out that the structure of Holston Home is just a "place," like the homes

others live in. But it's not just an environment, he said; it's an extended family. Traci Dolese, decorator for the day, made a helmet of black and white balloons, centered with orange and white ones, as a photo background opportunity. She designed a scoreboard that included the names of each of the departments at Holston Home. Yard line tablecloths covered the tables, which were centered with pom-pom-filled Mason jars painted to look like footballs. The tables sat on an astroturf-looking surface. Orange, white and black balloons were used throughout the venue. Traci painted a photo of Smokey as a decoration also. Ella Price prepared the food for the occa-

sion. Her favorite entertaining is themed parties, so she said she was in her element. She explained there were two tents of food, one for Florida, and one for UT. In between, there was an alligator waffle cake made of red velvet so that it showed red
