

# Youth Builders Learn About Holston Home Mentoring Program

Youth Builders of Greenville Inc. learned about the mentoring program at Holston United Methodist Home for Children at its most recent meeting, held Feb. 28 at Greenville Cumberland Presbyterian Church.

President Sandi Bible welcomed members and guests before Jo Knabel gave the invocation. The minutes and the treasurer's report were presented and approved. Jeanne Stokes, reservations co-chair, reported 44 in attendance.

Jo Christensen decorated the tables for the luncheon with bird houses in recognition of National Bird Feeding Month.

The guest speaker was Will Martin, director of mentoring and fostering at Holston United Methodist Home for Children, who spoke on their mentoring program.

Martin explained that Holston Home serves thousands of children and is almost always at capacity. There are approximately 110 students at Holston Home, and mentors are needed to serve students from 11 to 23 years of age with a minimum commitment of one hour per week.

According to Martin, mentors provide a positive role model in the life of children. He encouraged members to consider mentoring, and provided guidelines for taking part in the program.
