# A Word from the President



Science was the only thing that made sense to Casey when he arrived at Holston Home. It was logical, it could predict and explain the changing seasons, the changing moons, and the changing tides, but nothing could explain the changing tides of the last fifteen years where both of his grandparents committed suicide, his father did not want anything to do with him, his peers victimized him, he experienced multiple periods of homelessness, and he found himself in the same room with his mother during one of her several suicide attempts.

No one was surprised when Casey came to our campus with scars from cutting himself, recurrent nightmares, and a firm belief that there was no God. The caring staff at Holston United Methodist Home for Children began the journey with him exactly where he was - vulnerable and buried under layers of disappointments.

Casey found a consistent and predictable friend in Ms. Valerie who began to talk with him and pray for him in the mornings as he would get ready for school. He could tell there was something different about her.

Every Sunday and again during weekly Bible Study, Casey heard about man's failures and God's unfailing grace through Jesus. He found himself face to face with the unavoidable questions that all of us must answer, "Is Jesus who He says He is?" and

"Can He change my life and my future." After many long discussions with Abel Carrico, our Director of Christian Life, about everything from man's sin in the garden to Jesus' death, burial, and resurrection, the Holy Spirit revealed God's plan of salvation to Casey – and he BELIEVED!

His past and his hurts didn't magically go away, but his fear, his nightmares and his sadness have. Yesterday, he came back to Beacon School from working at our barn and stopped by the office with a smile and excited conversation. As he was leaving he saw that his counselor didn't seem herself. He left her with this encouragement, "Ms. Jamie, you look like something's bothering you. Do you need a hug?" You need a hug! He then gave her a big hug and a smile as he went back to his classroom.

With your prayer and support, God is using Holston Home to write different endings to life stories like Casey's. You see Casey didn't strike out. Our Mighty Casey joined the winning team of the God of the Universe and now knows the healing power of grace, forgiveness, and hope. Thank you for being a part of this ministry.



They are finding rest in Jesus. It is a blessing to see the mission of this organization played out in a simple walk to the dining hall as three boys receive the hope and healing that comes through Jesus Christ.

Perhaps the stress of family breakdown has resulted in their being abandoned by family or removed from their family and placed in foster homes or other resources. As a result, children lose their identity and their selfesteem and are cast into a state of hopelessness. They lose their interest in school and in life itself.

Mrs. Wiley determined, when she established Holston Home 120 years ago, that every child had the right to a safe place to live, an opportunity to develop their God-



given abilities, and should learn about Jesus. Most of the children have never attended church. Some are even involved in cults or gangs. Many of them have had their taste of drugs and destructive behavior, but as they experience love their lives change. When children feel loved and worthwhile they respond in a positive way.







# A Glimpse Of History

AT HARVEST TIME, CHILDREN PITCHED IN TO HELP CAN FOOD FOR THE WINTER

During this harvest season, I am reminded of the years when Holston Orphanage produced most of its



own food or relied on friends from around the Holston Conference to help out. In those years past preparations were made to feed hundreds of children each year. The gardens were always well planted to produce corn, beans, tomatoes, and other vegetables that were

not only consumed fresh but were preserved to feed the children during the winter months. The boys planted and harvested and the girls prepared and canned. When fruits and vegetables were brought to the kitchen, the girls worked in groups of ten to break beans, shuck corn, peel and slice apples, or whatever was necessary to either put the food on the table or preserve it for future use.

Food preparation was done under the supervision of staff such as Melvin Moore and friends like Montivilla Montgomery and Sue Ella Clingan. The the cooks taught the girls much about food, its preparation and preservation that would be helpful to them in years to come. Although harvest times always mean difficult work and hard long hours, the children worked together as family to do what was necessary to take care of each other.
