**I** saac was riding with Rusty, one of our maintenance staff, to help with needs at our Knoxville office. Isaac loves to work and especially with maintenance and our landscaping. We always look for opportunities to teach our youth practical life-skills and to expose them to as many healthy and caring adults as we can. This experience was one of those days to accomplish both. While driving

down I-40, our maintenance truck broke down. Isaac watched while Rusty managed the situation and did so without any change to his attitude. This observation led to a deep conversation where Rusty was able to share his story of how Jesus changed his life and the power of faith in Him. This divine appointment ended with Isaac ask-



ing Jesus to be Lord of his life too. I had the honor of seeing Isaac and thirteen other young people get baptized with a sanctuary full of family and friends. I watched our Christian Life team baptize kid after kid until Isaac came up. Then, I watched as one of our maintenance men joined him at the front to baptize his little brother in Christ. Isaac wanted Rusty to be the one to baptize him and I was frozen in praise and gratitude as I thought about how God is always at work. He is never taken by surprise or calling an emergency meeting of the Trinity. He does indeed work all things together for good for those who love Him and are called according to His purposes — even in broken down maintenance trucks.

During this time of uncertainty, I want to encourage you that He is still working all things for good for Isaac, you, and Holston Home for Children. Like so many ministries our donations from the churches have been significantly down as churches have been navigating this crisis. We completely understand, and our hearts are with our churches and families who have been impacted by COVID-19 and its effects. Much like our history recounts from the Great Depression, God has continued to provide in so many different ways. One of the most striking ways He has met our needs is through decades of estate gifts.

At Holston Home we do not use estate gifts for our ongoing operating expenses. We set these gifts aside and each year we draw down 4 percent of the

# COUNT YOUR BLESSINGS

A manda and Jamie Bradley have been fostering for the Southwest Virginia office since 2015. They have fostered nine children and adopted a sibling set and are currently fostering one child in addition to their five girls and four boys! The Bradleys live on a 30-acre farm; a "kid's heaven" with lots of space to play and enjoy their many pets and farm animals.

Amanda is a former schoolteacher turned stayat-home mom and homeschools all nine children. Jamie is a contractor and built a large building on their farm that serves as the "Bradley Schoolhouse." The Bradleys have provided a loving Christ-centered home putting their faith in God and teaching their children about Jesus daily. The whole family is very involved with the many activities the children participate in.

Three years ago, the Bradleys adopted Abel, a 2year-old medically fragile foster child. Abel had three slightly older sisters, Abigail, Alayla and Ava, who still lived with their biological parents. Since Abel came to live with them, the Bradleys had been praying for

removed from their home. When they learned that the girls had been removed from their home, Amanda let officials know that she had adopted their full sibling and wanted to foster these three sisters. She was told that they had placed the girls elsewhere, but after two disruptions in regular foster care the DSS case manager called Amanda to let the family know they could foster the girls. The girls were placed in the Bradley home and were so happy to see their baby brother. They never knew what had happened to him. The girls have some emotional issues and have been difficult to foster at times, but the Bradleys made a commitment to themselves and to the Lord and they were going to stand in faith by that commitment. In December of 2019, these three big sisters became part of the Bradley family! While Abel continues to have some medical issues, he is basically a healthy and very happy little boy now!

Amanda and Jamie have given their lives, their money, their free time, and their hearts to these children. They will quickly tell you that they could only

## A Glimpse of History

A prophet once lived among us! In a report to the District Conference, Dr. Walter Smith, Superintendent of Holston Orphanage from 1942 to 1960, stated:

"We have done a fair job of feeding, clothing, sheltering, educating, and providing spiritual nurture for the children we have cared for, but we have not and are not now meeting the emotional needs of thousands upon thousands of emotionally disturbed children."

In his report to the Annual Conference in 1954, Dr. Smith said, "We are coming to believe that children who must live in an institution are the most emotion-



ally disturbed of all and that, if they profit best they must have all the love, understanding, sympathy, psychiatric, medical and scientific help it is possible to give them. We must not crowd too many into one cottage. They must be treated as individuals and caused to know that they are persons with souls and that they are of value. They must be led to believe that God and society need them, and that they can, without question, contribute to society." We took Dr. Smith's words seriously, and today we have a better understanding of how to help children who struggle with life.
