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



## Financial Report 2022-23

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#### WHERE THE MONEY COMES FROM



#### SPECIAL GIFTS AND BEQUESTS

From time to time we receive special gifts and bequests for the benefit of Holston Home. These special gifts and bequests are not part of or reported in the operating budget as they are received directly into the Endowment fund. The purpose of the Endowment is to provide funding, in perpetuity, to the Home to ensure the continuance of its mission.

### **Our Services**

In 2022–23, our services touched the lives of 531 children in Tennessee & Virginia.

The services that Holston Home provided are identified below.

**CHRISTIAN LIFE** is the foundation of all our services. Last year, 58 of our youth made first-time professions of faith and 52 were baptized.

**BRUMIT CENTER** provided preparation for adult living services to 22 youth who were aging out of the foster care system and facing the challenges of adulthood.

**RESIDENTIAL CARE** provided nurture, care, education and treatment for 193 adolescent boys and girls. These centers provide the most intensive services in our continuum of care for youth who may have been abused, may have emotional or behavioral problems, or find themselves struggling with negative influences in their community.

**HOME-TO-STAY PROGRAM**, provided up to four months of family counseling services to successfully reunite 19 children and youth with their families.

RIVER ACADEMY, our accredited oncampus school, served 8 special education day students from area school systems and provided education for 201 of the youth in our residential and Brumit programs. During 2022–23, 22 youth earned high school diplomas and 11 enrolled in college or technical school.

**FOSTER HOMES** provided loving care in a family setting for 105 children and youth. Of

these, 42 children were served through our three Family Service Centers in Tennessee and 63 children were cared for through Southwest Virginia. Another 10 of our foster children were adopted by their foster families. The Intercountry Adoption Program had 2 placements. Our staff also assisted 13 other families in completing adoption services.

**EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION CENTERS** served 213 preschool children and infants. Both of our centers received the highest rating of Three-Stars by state licensing entities.

**HOPE & THRIVE ACADEMY** provides educational opportunities for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities and served 25 students in life skills, computer literacy, job skills, money math and personal finance.

**RECOVERING HEARTS** helped 28 women who struggled with addiction and 5 ladies graduated from our program. We saw 2 reunifications of children to mothers along with 20 first-time professions of faith and 15 baptisms.

"TASTE AND SEE" FOOD TRUCK ministers to at-risk communities by creating meaningful relationships that allow us to share the gospel while meeting tangible food insecurity needs. From March to June, 809 children and 446 adults were reached.
