INDEPENDENCE TRACK

Students enrolled in the **Independence Track** work or volunteer in the community on Monday and Tuesday utilizing supports through ECF Choices, Vocational Rehabilitation or MAPs, then meet for classes on Thursday and Friday from 8:30 AM - 2:30 PM during the academic year (August - May). Summer Adventure Activities will be scheduled during June and July.

Families registering for the **Independence Track** have the opportunity to apply for financial aid. Tuition rates are on a sliding scale fee based on household income. For families who elect not to apply for financial aid, tuition will automatically be set at the full tuition amount of \$11,000/year or \$916.67/month.

Tuition rates are based on admittance, not attendance, and will not be prorated. Tuition is paid on a monthly basis and due on the 5th of each month. Tuition can be paid by ACH Draft, check, or cash.

THRIVING

- 92% of our Independence Track students have integrated jobs in the community earning competitive wages.
- Over ¼ of our **Independence Track** students live independently in the community with minimal supports.
- Several have earned their First Degree and Second Degree Black Belts in Taekwondo.
- Several have their driver's license and learners permit.









ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Must have a diagnosed intellectual or developmental disability.
- Must have a copy of student's most recent psychological or psychoeducational evaluation.
- Must have a copy of student's most recent annual physical exam.
- Must be capable of responding to an emergency signal, such as a fire alarm or verbal prompting to evacuate.
- Must be able to navigate stairs unassisted.
- Must be able to self-regulate emotions. Students may not have behaviors which severely disrupt other students or program activities; or have behaviors which place students, staff members, or others in danger.
- Must have reliable transportation to and from Hope & Thrive Academy.
- Student must be able to provide for their own self-care (toileting, eating without assistance, etc).
- Must be at least 18 years of age and no longer receive Special Education services through a private or public institution.
- Must have a state issued photo ID.
- Must be able to self-administer prescribed or OTC medications with supervision of a staff member.
